

Profile Story - Shelby Ortiz

Shelby Ortiz is a 27 year old woman living in Macon, Georgia with her three children, ranging in age from 4 months old to 3 years old. She grew up in the foster care system beginning at the age of five until she signed herself out of care at the age of eighteen. She had her first child at the age of 23 and she describes feeling a great sense of purpose and meaning through becoming a mother. She currently works night shifts at Waffle House and takes care of her children during the day.

"I want to give my kids everything that I didn't have —not in materialistic things, but in family and wisdom and support."

Upon getting connected with a representative from Macon AIM, she has received help with baby items(such as clothing, diapers, and wipes), counseling services and finding a primary care doctor. Ms. Ortiz stated that each of the organizations assisting her have been very helpful to her and her family.

"Each time when I think there's no other option, she finds something for me."

Ms. Ortiz has goals of one day becoming a correctional officer when her kids begin to attend school. She wants to work hard to ensure her children grow up happy and healthy, equipped with everything they need. She is very glad that organizations like Macon AIM exist, so she can be pointed in the direction of countless services and tools.. She stated that this assistance has helped her to keep going and remember that she is not alone.
